RESURRECTION

The most important fact that happened on this earth is Jesus Christ's resurrection. An event which is put in question by many, but which is central to Christians. In fact, it is so important that our Holy Mother Church not only commemorates it at Easter, and this for a whole week, but also every Sunday of the year if not every day of the year. At every mass throughout the year, when through the invocation of the priest, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of the Lord and something incredible happens. The Lord rises from the bread and wine to become Him. This is not noticed by unbelievers but only acknowledged by believers, who, through eating His Body prepare theirs to follow Him, to be not only His disciples but to become His brothers and sisters.



The fellow who was directing me at the United Kingdom Atomic Energy Authority Culham's laboratory was a convinced atheist, as was his wife. They were most offended by my insistence that they were wrong. That fellow physicists' work could be wrong they did not want to acknowledge publicly; after all, there is such a thing as solidarity among fellow professionals. You never put in question the published work of others; you just let it fall into oblivion.

I have since then examined the work of many great scientists and found that most of their papers are not recognized today. Alternative understandings have risen since, which means that some theories had – finally – to be discarded and replaced.

Now some of those theories have the great problem that they are logically mutually exclusive. A wave, for example, is something which occupies a lot of room while a particle, like a speck of dust, is very small. How can something act like one and the other according to the effect we examine? How can Someone be at the same time both God and man? How do we become both as well as Him? Can an electron – a particle of a certain charge and mass, whose effect can be noticed in a simple experiment, can also be a wave? If it cannot, atoms cannot exist, and neither can we in our world, as we, our bodies, are made of atoms and molecules.

God wants each of us for a reason: each one of us has a job to do, a life to live, a trajectory God wants us to perform. We are to manifest His presence in this world. If we bloom in the flower God wills us to become, we will be transplanted into His garden. We will become part of His Son. We will have achieved our role in this novel He is writing. We will live with Him, in Him, for Him, by Him for ever and ever. Amen! Alleluia!


