

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME The Beginning of the Galilean Ministry Jesus Calls the First Disciples

Mark 1:14-20

Reflection:

- Mark's Gospel is written to answer two questions: 'Who is Jesus?' and 'What are Jesus' disciples meant to be like?'. Jesus proclaims the Good News of God not just any good news, but God's good news for the world. Today we get the beginning of an answer to the second: anyone can be a disciple--spectacular gifts or education are not requirements for eligibility. What matters is availability and a willingness to follow where Jesus leads. Discipleship also involves a change in our values until they measure up to the values of Jesus.
- The Gospel scene locates the moment when Jesus launches his public life after John had been arrested or handed over. There is a subtle hint here that this may happen to Jesus, and likewise to his disciples. They will need courage to stay the course.
- God makes his presence known in the person of his Son Jesus, come to establish true justice, with
 compassion for all of humanity. He needs help to bring this about, so he calls disciples to follow him. We
 can marvel at Jesus' captivating personality that evoked such an immediate, unconditional response
 from them
- Jesus begins his ministry by calling a group to follow him. He gives his disciples a mission to catch
 people for the kingdom of God. He chooses as his companions very ordinary people, people with no
 wealth or position. What is striking is that they have no certainties, little knowledge of him and yet they
 risk all for him. 'Come, follow me'. The ways of following Jesus are as varied as people themselves are.
 But they always entail breaking free from what one was before.

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, you are our life itself, pointing to what we can become and calling out all our power of service and devotion. We leave the frailty that is in us open to your touch. We commit the joy and the brokenness of our life to you. Lord, You continue to call ordinary people - like me. In all my human interactions may I bring your good news to others. You call the disciples to follow You and share in your mission. Their response is radical and immediate. May nothing hinder me from generously responding to your daily call to follow You. Amen.

CHURCH REMAINS CLOSED, PUBLIC GATHERINGS FOR MASS SUSPENDED

The Archdiocese of Montreal has advised all Montreal parishes, missions, and religious communities to close all places of worship, suspending gatherings for the celebration of Mass effective January 9 through to February 8, 2021. This follows the Jan. 6 announcement by the Quebec government to return to stricter province-wide conditions of confinement.
