

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT The Transfiguration The Coming of Elijah

Mark 9:2-10

Reflection:

- Following Jesus up the mountain for Peter, James and John was a following in love which would be part of their lives in the future. Going up the mountain had its tough moments for the apostles, but the view at the top was worthwhile: the glory of Jesus and the invitation of God. This is the same for us in our discipleship.
- Prayer, too, can often feel like a long, arduous mountain walk. We can wonder sometime, is it worth it, and we don't always have the stamina. But if we give quality time to it, we discover that it is always worthwhile, and can come out of it in same sense of wonder, awe, and closeness to the Lord.

Praver:

Jesus, you needed this deep experience of transfiguration to strengthen you before your Passion. Life is hard, so help me to believe that like you I too am 'the beloved of God' as Saint Paul says (Rom 1:7). This will steady me in times of trial.

The divine is hidden within each of us. Sometimes my goodness shines out, and sometimes it is hidden. But everyone I meet, at home, on the streets, at work, in the hospital and the supermarket, is a daughter or son of God. Lord, help me in this Lenten season to see that everyone is a divine mystery in motion. Amen.

CHURCH REMAINS CLOSED. GATHERINGS FOR MASS SUSPENDED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

Since the latest provincial ministerial order announced last month, the Archdiocese of Montreal has advised all Montreal parishes, missions, and religious communities that they may open for Mass with a maximum of 10 participants, in addition to the necessary liturgical and technical facilitators.

Consequently, Archbishop Christian Lépine has entrusted the decision to reopen at the local level to parish communities themselves, i.e. to reopen immediately, or wait for an additional increase in numbers of participants, given the varied resources at their disposal.

For the time being, St. Aloysius Parish will remain closed until the situation improves and time comes when more people will be permitted to attend. We thank everyone for their patience and understanding.

In the meantime, we remind you that live-streaming of Sunday Mass continues to be available, as mentioned below.
