

# FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

# Some Greeks Wish to See Jesus **Jesus Speaks About His Death**

John 12:20-33

### Reflection:

- 'Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit.' In my life, what needs to fall into the earth and die in order for me to bear much fruit? With Holy Week fast approaching, Jesus is here speaking in the shadow of the valley of death. We remind ourselves that that without Good Friday there could be no Easter Sunday.
- The humble wish of the Greeks is to see Jesus. Lord that is my wish also. That is why I give this time to pray. May I see you more clearly, love you more dearly, and follow you more nearly, as the ancient prayer puts it. Jesus, in this time of prayer I imagine you putting a grain of wheat into my hand. You and I chat about what it can mean. When I next eat bread, it will have a deeper significance for me. When I share in the Eucharist, I will try to be aware that it means your own life, which is blessed, broken, shared out and consumed for the life of the world.

Prayer of Confession (inspired by John 12:20-33):

Lord, we confess that we love our lives as they are. We struggle with even the idea of change. We wrestle with the thought of doing things differently. But we know that the life we cling to is only a half-life. Only you, O Lord, can give us true life in full. Forgive us for holding onto the wrong things.

Teach us by your Spirit to let go of our agendas and assumptions. Help us to let go of our self-righteousness and false notions of power. Give us the strength and courage to try new things. Encourage us - and even push us to let go of ourselves so we can fully embrace you, Holy God. We pray these things in the name of Christ Jesus. Amen.

# UPDATE: CHURCH TO OPEN FOR PASSION SUNDAY AND EASTER

Following diocesan announcements released March 18, a maximum of 25 participants will now be permitted in liturgical celebrations in places of worship located in red zones as of Friday, March 26.

Thanks to our team of volunteers, public Mass will be offered at 9:30 a.m. Passion Sunday, March 28 and Easter Sunday, April 4 at Ste-Louise-de-Marillac Church (7901 Ste-Claire St.). Doors open at 9:15 a.m.

#### Registration required

With the maximum number of people that can be accommodated per celebration capped at 25, registrations for Sunday Mass will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis. To do so, please call the office at 514-351-3281 and leave your name with Joanne, as well as those of any other family members who will be attending. This will also help facilitate contact-tracing should the need arise. Joanne requests to please not send any messages to the parish Facebook page to reserve your place.

### Important reminders

- In compliance with required health safety measures, entry to the church will be restricted to the main doors on Honoré-Beaugrand St. (corner Ste-Claire St.)
- Please take your seat immediately upon arrival. Physical distancing of two meters between people from different households must be maintained at all times, as does the compulsory wearing of standard procedural masks.
- Departure: After Mass, everyone must exit the church by the side doors located at the north-end of the building (either side of the sanctuary).

#### Important reminders (cont'd)

• For Passion Sunday, though palms will be placed at the back of the church, there will be no initial distribution nor communal procession. Blessing of the palms and Gospel reading will be held as usual at the back of the church. The blessed palms will then be brought to the front and, only after Mass has concluded, will participants be able to pick up a palm on their way out. Please kindly take only one palm per family.

We thank you for your patience and collaboration in helping ensure the safety of staff, volunteers and parishioners as we enter into this next phase of liturgical life.
