

The Widow's Offering

Mark 12:38-44

Reflection:

- Honours and titles are hard hit in the Gospels. Seeking after them is at variance with the way of Jesus. Our age, even more than the time of Jesus, is so obsessed with image that it becomes the most important feature for our leaders, even more than their message or vision.
- Jesus proclaims that the woman who put in two small copper coins had given more than all the rich people. In a very real way it is a summary of the whole Gospel, for God looks at the heart and its readiness to give generously. Do I measure my worth by my external success, or am I free to look at my heart and be ready to be generous even in my poverty? I ask God to help me look at myself and at others as he looks at us.
- The poor widow, who would have been despised as such, is in fact the model for a disciple. The widow is humble and self-

forgetful. She does not know it, but she is living out the powerful message of the Beatitudes: Blessed are the poor. Blessed are the meek.

Prayer:

Jesus, help us to be alert to our selfishness and our judgemental attitudes towards others. We remember St Ignatius' prayer, "Take, O Lord, and receive my entire liberty, my memory, my understanding and my whole will. All that I am and all that I possess you have given me: I surrender it all to you to be disposed of according to your will. Give me only your love and your grace; with these I will be rich enough, and will desire nothing more." In Christ's name, Amen.

LEST WE FORGET: IN REMEMBRANCE

Nov. 5-11: As Veterans' Week continues, we take time to honour and remember those who have served our country, past and present, in times of war, military conflict and peace.

This year marks:

- the 70th anniversary of the Battle of Kapyong, Canada's most significant involvement in the Korean War
- the 30th anniversary of the end of the Gulf War in which more than 4000 Canadians served.
- the 10th anniversary of the end of Canada's combat mission in Afghanistan, in which more than 40,000 Canadians served – the largest deployment of troops since the Second World War. The conflict lasted more than 12 years – the longest in Canada's history.

Plans are underway for our annual Christmas Basket and Adopt-a-Child Campaign. As with last year, H.O.P.E. will be taking care of providing gift cards from *President's Choice®*, *Toys'R'Us®* and *Walmart®* to less fortunate families in our community. We have contacted two local schools and are awaiting a list of families in need. In addition to young families, we also provide for adults who are in need.

Our goal is to deliver Christmas greeting cards with these gift cards enclosed, no later than **Saturday**, **December 11**, in order for families to have time to use them for their Christmas shopping.

We are truly grateful for the support of our St. Aloysius family, without whom none of this is possible. We look to you again this year to help us bring cheer to these deserving families.
