E PLURIBUS UNUM

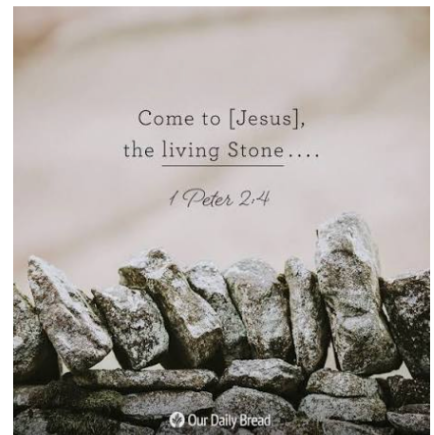


There I am again with a three-word Latin title! What a show-off I am! This being understood, this motto translates in plain English as «out of many, one». Now this motto is found on the Great Seal of the United States of America, our southern neighbour, who celebrated the 250th anniversary of its founding on July 4th. We have had many chances to view it, as the Great Seal is normally in the photo ops of its President. This being said, may I wish all US citizens a belated birthday. Us Canadians celebrated Canada Day on July 1st, three days earlier, just a week after the feast of St. John the Baptist, now in Quebec called the «Fête Nationale».

The reason why this motto ended on the seal is that it was already in use. Among the great men who used the phrase is Saint Augustine, who wrote in his Confessions «e pluribus unum facere» that is, «make one out of many».

Numbers are very important, some might say, significant. Many words are related to them. For instance, from the Latin word «centum», which means «hundred» we have a Centurion in the Roman Army, which was a commander of a hundred men, just like a century is a hundred years.

If you check online, you will find that that motto or something very close is found in the works of many Latin authors, or in the equivalent Greek, but that the three Latin words appear only in Saint Augustine's writings. And this has to do with something ecclesiastical, not societal or governmental. What Saint Augustine of Hippo was taking about is the simple fact that an assembly of Christians is such that they all become one. Why? By unity of purpose, by love for each other and by Almighty God, Who, after all, is first and foremost Love. The very simple meaning of the word «community», the unity of many people who have come together. If you look at the banner on the right side of the sanctuary at Sainte Louise you will find the expression of «living stones» (pierres vivantes), referring to the fact that the various Parish members form one building, one Church.



On the other hand, Saint Paul talked about us forming «one body» although this body has many members. I like his comparison better. In a way, we form the body of Christ by being the hands and feet of our Lord in our hurting world, as Father Joe used to say. Think of not only the number of organs in a body, but even more the number of molecules, of atoms found in a body. What I have described goes from one to many, from many to so much more, and from so much more to even many times more.

We say that there is but just one God like there is just one body; on the other hand, this God is three Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit just like the one body has arms, legs, feet, hands, and so on. So we have God as One and as Three: a triune God, the Trinity.



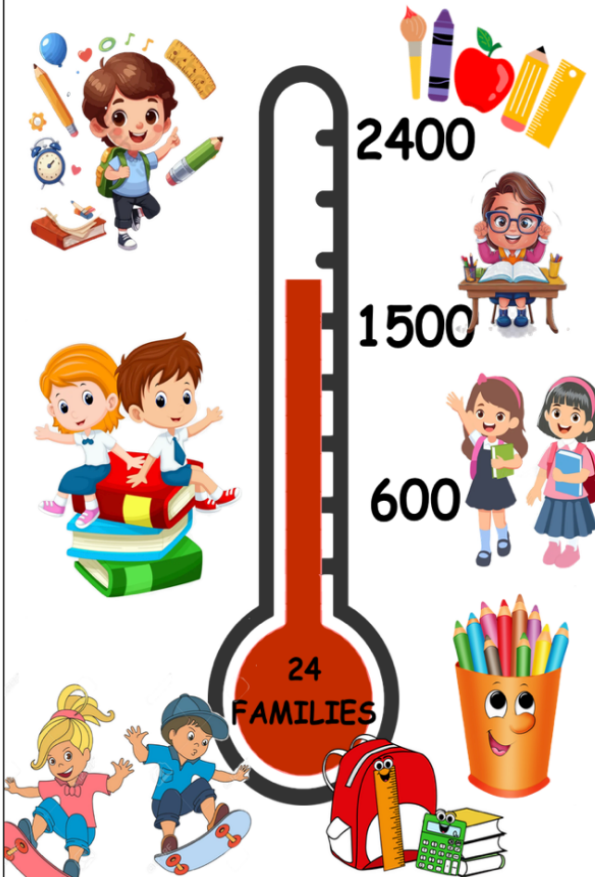
