

Thought

ST. BRENDAN CHURCH: RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASSES

We have been working diligently to put all the safety precautions in place so that we can open the Church safely. We hope to resume our public Masses on the weekend of August 29-30. Two Masses will be offered: Saturday at 5 p.m. and Sunday at 11 a.m. Seating capacity is limited.

Because we are limited in how many people the Church can accommodate during the celebration, reservations are required.

In order to reserve your seat, either as an individual or as a family, you MUST REGISTER by 2 p.m. on Wednesday, August 26. Families who live together IN THE SAME HOUSEHOLD, may sit together. Masks must be worn and hands must be sanitized upon entering the church. Registrations will begin on Wednesday, August 19 and ending 2 p.m on August 26 for the August 29/30th Masses.

Registrations will continue weekly for all weekend Masses and must be received no later than 2 p.m. on the Wednesday prior to the weekend you will be attending. There will be NO registrations taken on the weekends, only during the week from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Please let us know which Mass you will be attending and how many in your household will attend as well.

If you still feel uncomfortable about attending Mass during the pandemic, celebrations will still continue to be livestreamed on Facebook Live.

Fr. Paul wants to personally thank everyone who has continued to support our communities during these past few months. Your continued support has been much needed and greatly appreciated.
