



21st SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reflection:

"And you," Jesus goes on, "who do you say I am?" It was a moment of truth, a very special moment in his disciples' relationship with their Master. Simon speaks up: "You are the Messiah, the Christ, the Son of the living God." It is a huge step forward for Peter and his companions. As we shall see, it is not yet a total recognition of his identity or mission but is an exciting moment in their relationship with him.



 The focus shifts immediately to Simon. He is praised for his insight but Jesus makes it clear that it comes from divine inspiration. Am I open to divine inspiration as I go about my day or now in my prayer time?
 Who is Jesus for me?

Jesus asks about what others say, but it is what Peter says that is important to him. Behind the words Jesus was not, for Peter, another great or admirable figure but was the one who could change his life.

Lord, I linger with this question: what are you to me?
 I give witness to who Jesus is in my life, not only about what I say but by how I let Jesus change and reconfigure my priorities.

Jesus could trust Peter to be honest – he would say what was on his mind and in his heart.

 As Jesus asks me the same question, I answer honestly, knowing that nothing I say will alienate Jesus. If I am uncertain about what to say, I invite Jesus to look at my life and to see how I give witness.

Prayer: Lord Jesus Christ, use us, like You used Simon Peter, to spread Your Gospel throughout the world and help us to always defend Your Church against attacks from the netherworld. **Amen.**

RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASSES AT ST. ALOYSIUS PARISH

Thanks to our team of volunteers, weekly public Masses will resume 9:30 a.m. on **Sunday, August 30** at Ste-Louise-de-Marillac Church (7901 Ste-Claire St.) Doors open at 9:15 a.m.

Safety protocols during the pandemic:

In compliance with required health safety measures, entry to the church will be restricted to the main doors on Honoré-Beaugrand St. (corner Ste-Claire). Mask-wearing is obligatory. Parishioners will be asked to sanitize their hands upon entering the church. and make their way directly to their pew, maintaining a physical distance of at least two metres at all times. Gathering will not be permitted at the back of the church, either before or after Mass. In addition, no one is permitted to use the washrooms unless it is an emergency.

Distribution of Communion:

To proceed for Communion, please approach the centre aisle in single file, maintaining two metres between the person ahead of you. Once you reach the Minister of Communion, please extend your hands so he/she can gently drop the host into your palm. Do not consume the host until you return to your seat where you can safely and briefly remove your mask. Please use the side aisles to return to your pew.

Departure:

After Mass, everyone must exit the church by the side doors located on either side of the altar.

We have volunteers in place who will be there to assist and guide you.

Registration required:

In order to attend Mass, you must first reserve your place. Please register by leaving your name as well as those of any other family members who will be attending. This will also help facilitate contact-tracing should the need arise. Registration will be accepted Monday through Thursday prior to each Sunday Mass. Following Mass online:

Masses will continue to be livestreamed via Fr. Paul's profile on Facebook Live for those who do not feel comfortable returning to Mass onsite during the pandemic.
