

The Labourers in the Vineyard

Reflection

- A difficult parable! Should the landowner have given the 'late' workers more or the 'early' workers less? He gave all a day's wage as anything less would have been derisory. That being the case the landowner was generous, not mean. What do you think? Do you see an application to your own life?
- God gives his love, all of his love, to every person without exception if they open themselves to this love. It does not matter whether that happens early or late in life as this love can never be earned, only accepted. The fact that the latecomers were only employed at the last hour does not make their needs any less than those who came earlier. How big is my need for God today?
- The phrase, 'the kingdom of heaven' often stands for God, and the central revelation here is just how generous God is. Think of the generosity of God the Father and ask that your heart may be opened to the fact that God is pure love, nothing else.
 - Think of this love as a great waterfall, with everyone invited to come close to it and be drenched by its spray. In prayer and life you are meeting this lavish God who does not know when or how or why to stop loving you. This love is inexhaustible, but it is for sharing! I am meant to be generous with the love given to me, and not hoard it like a miser.
- We all find something disconcerting in this parable. Perhaps we need to look at this parable from the
 perspective of the work in the vineyard. Jesus encouraged us to pray for more workers to be sent in the
 vineyard, for the harvest is plentiful and the workers few. Being called to work in the Father's vineyard is
 a privilege, a grace to ask for.
 - 'Are you envious because I am generous?' I let this question linger in my heart, and ask for the grace of inner freedom when I look at my gifts and limitations, and at those of the persons around me. True love rejoices at the gifts others have.

Prayer

Father, today I open my heart and mind to the great things You have in store for my future. I choose to be faithful. I choose to prepare. I won't look to the left or to the right, but I will keep my eyes on You, Jesus, the Author and Finisher of my faith in Jesus' name. Amen.
